The solo(s) may or may not appear to be improvised and could be a rehearsed or pre-written solo.</p> <p>Improvised solo performers display some lapse of confidence that may be addressed through additional preparation of the player(s)</p>	<p>Improvisation lacks a variety of styles / genres and is missing a demonstration of understanding of the improvised presentation</p> <p>The improvisation attempts exceed the performance level of the soloist(s).</p> <p>Solos performed display a general lack of confidence that can be addressed through further practice and a re-evaluation of solo programming.</p>
